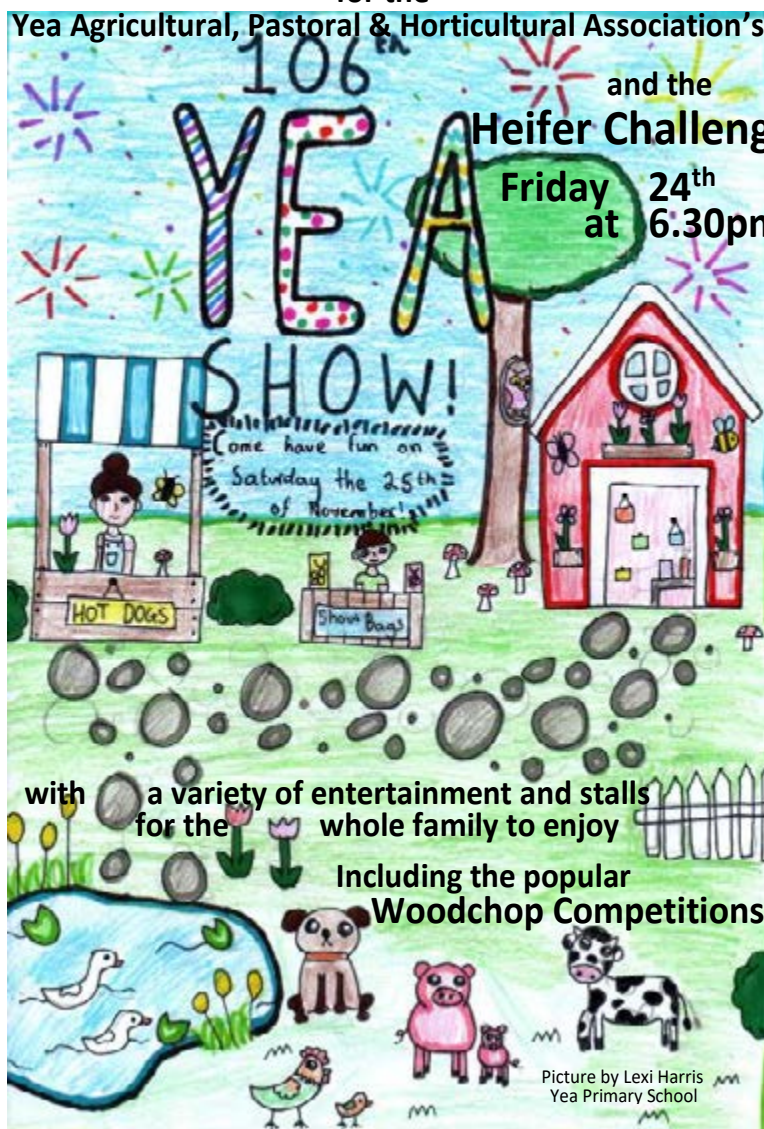

2. Entry fees must be paid on making entries, which must be submitted in writing on forms supplied by the Association.
3. Prize money will not be paid until after 4.30pm and upon presentation of prize voucher.
4. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED IF A CLOSING DATE IS ADVERTISED.**
5. EV and RAS height certificates accepted for horses.
6. All protests or objections in connection with the show must be made in writing and lodged (with a deposit of \$100) with the secretary not later than 8pm on the Monday following the show. These will be considered at the next ordinary meeting of the committee. In the event of any protest being upheld and the prize awarded to a second competitor, any further protest against the new award must be made within 7 days of the new award. Should the protest prove frivolous, the deposit shall be forfeited.
7. At 4.30pm the Exhibit Pavilion will be closed to enable exhibitors to take possession of their goods. Only exhibitors or designated proxies will be admitted after that hour.
8. All written communications should be addressed to the secretary.
9. The association does not accept responsibility for any errors or omissions in the schedule.
10. The association will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accidents on the grounds or premises.
11. Any prize money not claimed or collected within 3 months of the date of the show becomes the property of the association.

All cattle exhibited including calves must have a NLIS tag.

PESTIVIRUS (BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHOEA VIRUS) All cattle entered in the Beef Cattle Competition, including calves at foot, must be tested for Pestivirus (Bovine Viral Diarrhoea Virus) and certified as non-PI (Persistently Infected). Certification of testing and proof of non-PI status is required in the form of a signed Veterinary Certificate or Laboratory Report, clearly listing animals and their identification.

All Exhibitors are required to complete the NCHD (Version 26/10/16) and submit this with entries.

- a) All exhibitors must provide a correct Johnes Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS) with their entries.
- b) Exhibits will be stalled based on the J-BAS provided.

All cattle entered in the Stud Beef Cattle Section, must be entered or eligible for entry in the Approved Herd Book.

All Bulls 1 year and over must be led with a nose ring lead.

Participation in Grand Parade at 1pm is required to collect prize money.

The competition will be on hoof to hook with 1st \$100. 2nd \$75, 3rd \$50 in each class. The overall champion will be selected from Carcass.

Ribbons and prize money will be distributed at the Cattle Producers' Dinner on 2nd December.

Hoof Awards: Cattle will be assessed live & judged as to their market suitability for the above specification.

Carcass Awards: Carcasses will be appraised using the AUSMEAT method of carcass appraisal. Points will be allocated for HSCWT, fat depth, fat colour, fat distribution, eye muscle area (in relation to HSCWT and meat colour. The carcass judge will have the right of excluding carcasses from awards.

Carcass pricing: Carcass valuation will be negotiated by the Association and Works Management. Individual carcass value will be determined by use of price grids, as has been the case in past years. Carcass pricing will have no bearing on carcass awards.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Cattle entered in the competition are to have no permanent teeth when mouthed on the day of the show, The entries can be of either sex.
2. Ear tags in the right ear of the animal as you face them will identify entries. These will be supplied by Yea AP&H Association and must be placed in the animal's ear before arriving at the show grounds.
3. ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE A NLIS EARTAG ATTACHED.
4. All cattle entered for hoof judging will participate in the carcass competition.
5. The P8 site (rump) will be used to measure the fatness of the carcass in accordance with the AUSMEAT language.
6. Carcass awards (1st, 2nd, 3rd) will be given to entries on a points basis (max 100) for hot standard carcass weight, fat depth (PB), eye muscle area, fat colour and muscle colour, Carcass outside the ideal weight range by 5% or more will be ineligible for an award. Dark cutting carcass will also be ineligible.
7. All carcasses remain the property of the exhibitor until cleared of meat inspection procedures.
8. All entrants must complete a National Vendor Declaration and hand this to the steward on arrival.
9. No exhibit will be accepted with any visible disease or parasite.
10. The Yea Agricultural, Pastoral and Horticultural Association reserves the right of withdrawing any entry. Entries withdrawn forfeit the entry fee.
11. Carcasses will be sold by the association on behalf of the owner, with appropriate slaughter levy and other fees as determined deducted accordingly.
12. The exhibitor's ABN must be included on the entry. Cattle will not be accepted from exhibitors who do not supply an ABN.

The Australian Young Farmer Challenge (AYFC) is an engaging, entertaining and fast paced competition for young rural people (aged 18 - 35 years). The AYFC is a demonstration of the talent, skills, techniques and safe work methods that young farmers use everyday.

Teams compete in a series of skills-based challenges related to farming with a strong emphasis on technique and safety. Competitors are asked to do their best to complete the challenges correctly against the clock as well as focus on safety, and most importantly, enjoy the competition and provide entertainment to the audience.

Rules & Regulations

1. Eligible Teams

- a. Consist of four (4) competitors
- b. Have both male and female competitors. All female or all male teams are not eligible to enter.
- c. Have Competitors with minimum skills required depending on the competition activities such as :
 - I. Hold a current drivers licence reconised by an Australian State or Territory.
 - II. Be capable of hitching a trailer to a car and backing the trailer.
 - III. Be competent at leading livestock, including horses, sheep and cattle.

2. Eligible competitors

- a. Have Competitors aged between 18 and 35 years of age on the day the National AYFC takes place. competitors may be required to provide proof of age.
- b. Competitors must reside in the State they are representing for the National YFC Competition or be within 50km of their State's border.
- c. Compete at their own risk.
- d. Undertake all Competition activities in a safe manner.
- e. Wear appropriate clothing to compete.

3. Competition Guidelines

- a. The winning Team will be the Team that completes all the challenges correctly, in a safe manner and in the fastest time.
- b. Each Team will have a dedicated judge that watches each challenge of the competition. The Judge will determine when the Team is permitted to move onto the next challenge. The Judge's decision is final.
- c. The Team will be permitted to progress when each challenge has been completed correctv and safely.
- d. The Team must completed correctly and safely and using the correct Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
- e. Any errors made during each challenge will result in the Team having to re-do the challenge to complete it correctly, or receive a time penalty, based on the nature of the challenge.
- f. Teams can incur a time penalty for safety breaches.
- g. Teams may be disqualified in the event of a multiple safety breaches and/or dangerous activity affecting competitors, Officials or spectators.

OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Health Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals on offer. Some states/territories require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document. e.g. Johne's disease (JD) in WA and for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) in Tasmania. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at: www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements.

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

QUESTION 3 & 4: BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHOEA VIRUS (PESTIVIRUS) TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Dairy Cattle may be tested through bulk milk testing. Contact your veterinarian for assistance. Producers who don't know the answer to these questions should tick the 'N' box.

QUESTIONS 5: JOHNE'S DISEASE TESTING

Note: JD is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Check test - testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. QUESTION 6 & 7: JOHNE'S DISEASE

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property(s). Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The Johne's Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS) is a voluntary tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available at www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools. The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the 'JD in cattle' webpage).

The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual - Grazing Livestock Production provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

Grazing of non-bovine species – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risk for all your livestock.

TREATMENTS AND VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments within the last six (6) months and vaccinations within the last twelve (12) months. 375gm of Mixed Fruit, 3/4 cup brown sugar, 1 teaspoon mixed spice, ½ cup water, 125gm butter, ½ teaspoon of Bicarbonate of soda, ½ cup of sherry, 2 eggs lightly beaten, 2 tablespoons of marmalade, 1 cup of self-raising flour, 1 cup of plain flour, ¼ teaspoon of salt.

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
